Programs provided by the Norman County SWCD

Cost Share Program-a state program where landowners can receive up to 75% cost share on approved practices such as Field Windbreaks, Filter Strips, Sed Basins, Livestock Waste Management and Streambank Protection Projects.

Tree Sales, Planting & Matting- we offer tree sales, planting and matting (fabric for trees) to any landowners or operators in Norman County. We can reduce the cost of these programs through the cost share program.

Local Water Management - a state program for promoting and protecting surface and ground water quality.

Wetland Conservation Act- to fulfill the state requirements for protecting wetlands.

Feedlot Program- we are delegated by the Pollution Control Agency to issue permits, register feedlots and do on-site inspections.

State Revolving Loan Fund- 3% low interest loans can be applied for; Subsurface Sewage Treatment Systems (SSTS), conservation tillage equipment, animal waste systems and erosion control structures.

Well Monitoring Program- we measure ground water on 3 wells every month and 4 wells twice a year. This program is funded from the DNR.

Rainfall Monitoring- 9 volunteers from around the county record daily precipitation. Call our office if you would like to volunteer.

AIS Program– Our office is in charge of the Aquatics Invasive Species for Norman County. We educate folks on the prevention of AIS.

Buffer Program - Our office is in charge of providing technical assistance to landowners for complying with the buffer law.

Mn Ag Water Quality Certification Program

- This voluntary program certifies farmers for managing the land within their operation in a way that protects water quality and in turn they obtain regulatory certainty for a period of 10 years.
